August Luncheon Recap

The IFMA luncheon on August 20, 2013 consisted of 35 attendees participating in a round table discussion of current facilities topics and the activities supporting facilities. Discussion included the IFMA 11 competency areas of Operations and Maintenance, Real Estate, Human and Environmental Factors, Planning and Project Management, Leadership and Management, Finance, Quality Assessment and Innovation, Communications, Technology, Emergency Preparedness and Business Continuity, and Environmental Stewardship and Sustainability. The items of discussion included the equipment in buildings, control of equipment, janitorial issues, furniture, consultant services, building support services, lighting, energy efficiency, etc. It was a great luncheon with a lot of good food and discussion.

August Tour Recap

Seven individuals associated with IFMA toured the Madison Central Library on August 22. The tour was facilitated by Mark Benno, the Library Administrative Services Manager, as he gave an overview of the renovation that is in process. The Central Madison Public Library located at 201 W Mifflin St is an agency of the City of Madison. It is governed by a nine-member Library Board of Directors appointed for three-year terms by the Mayor of Madison. Functioning under the aegis of Chapter 43 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the MPL board works in conjunction with the Mayor, Library Director Greg Mickells and staff, and the Madison Common Council to carry out the Library's mission in the community.

The renovation of the library included expanded the usable area by 25,000 square feet to a total of 119,200 square feet. This includes doubling the area for public usage from 40,000 to 80,000 square feet. The new capacity will be 1575 persons. The electrical usage is expected to remain the same as before the renovation. The new structure will continue to have a controlled access area for children. All the new surfaces were chosen with the ease of cleaning in mind. The roof of the second floor contains a partial green roof for collecting storm water and keeping runoff out of city storm sewers and lakes, as well as helping cool the building in the summer and insulating it in the winter.

Other innovations include photovoltaic (solar) panels on the roof which will reduce the power purchased from the city's power grid, an innovative low-flow air distribution system bringing fresh air into the building and distributing it from the floor (rather than from above), which is energy efficient and healthier for patrons, heating and cooling provided by state of the art energy-efficient in-floor systems, and a thoughtfully designed lighting systems that incorporate natural daylight, LED lighting and selective illumination of spaces where light is needed most. All the attendees appreciated the time Mark spent with us and his knowledge of the updated library space.





IFMA-Madison members who attended our Mallards Playoff game; it was a great event and just like us, the home team won, 14-6!

We were visited for an extended period of time by Maynard the Mallard, who zip-lined in from a telephone pole. The consensus

was no one had ever seen a duck on a telephone pole natively, but he didn't hang around it, either. Of course, a zip-line is natural to one and we didn't think twice about that.


